- (1) Held every year on 21 May, UNESCO leads the celebration of World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development highlighting not only the richness of the world's cultures, but also the essential role of intercultural dialogue for achieving peace and sustainable development.
- (2) A recent international emergency has proved the intrinsic value of the cultural and creative sector at generating social cohesion, educational resource or personal well-being in times of crisis. It has also underscored the sector's potential to generate economic growth, something which is too often underestimated.
- (3) With the adoption in September 2015 of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by the United Nations, and the resolution on Culture and Sustainable Development adopted by the UN General Assembly in December 2015, the message of the World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development is more important than ever. The 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) can best be achieved by drawing upon the creative potential of the world's diverse cultures and engaging in continuous dialogue to ensure that all members of society benefit from sustainable development.
- (4) Bridging the gap between cultures is urgent and necessary for peace, stability and development. Cultural diversity is a driving force of development, not only with respect to economic growth, but also as a means of leading a more fulfilling intellectual, emotional, moral and spiritual life. This is captured in the culture conventions, which provide a solid basis for the promotion of cultural diversity. Cultural diversity is thus an asset that is indispensable for poverty reduction and the achievement of sustainable development.
- (5) At the same time, acceptance and recognition of cultural diversity in particular through innovative use of media and Information and Communications Technologies (ICTs) are conducive to dialogue among civilizations and cultures, respect and mutual understanding.
- (6) In 2001, UNESCO adopted the Universal Declaration on Cultural Diversity. Next, in December 2002, the UN General Assembly, in its resolution 57/249, declared May 21 to be the World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development, and in 2015, the Second Committee of the UN General Assembly unanimously adopted the resolution on Culture and Sustainable Development, affirming culture's contribution to the three dimensions of sustainable development, acknowledging further the natural and cultural diversity of the world, and recognizing that cultures and civilizations can contribute to, and are crucial enablers of, sustainable development.
- (7) The day provides us with an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the values of cultural diversity and to achieve the goals of the UNESCO Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions adopted on 20 October, 2005.



- (1) The National Education Policy 2020 proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of education, including the educational structure, regulations and governance, to create a new system which is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century students. According to the policy, by 2025, at least 50% of learners through the school and higher education system shall have exposure to skill education, for which a clear action plan with targets and timelines are to be developed.
- (2) The policy aims to overcome the social status hierarchy associated with skill education and integration of skill education into mainstream education in all educational institutions in a phased manner. Beginning with skill exposure at early ages in middle and secondary school, quality skill education will be integrated smoothly into school and higher education.
- (3) Every child will learn at least one skill and is exposed to several more. This would lead to emphasizing the dignity of labour and importance of various vocations involving Indian arts and artisanship.
- (4) The development of skill capacities will go hand-in-hand with the development of 'academic' or other capacities. To achieve this objective, secondary schools will have to collaborate with Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), Polytechnics, Local Industry, etc. Skill labs will also be set up and created in the schools in a Hub and Spoke model, which will allow other schools to use the facility. Higher education institutions will offer skill education either on their own or in partnership with industry and other institutions.



- The process of a caterpillar turning into a butterfly is called metamorphosis.
- Four stages egg, caterpillar, pupa, adult butterfly
- Description of each stage
 - A butterfly starts its life as an egg. The female butterfly lays eggs on a plant. After few days eggs hatch into larva, commonly known as caterpillar.
 - Caterpillar feeds on the leaves of the plant on which it was hatched. In this stage, the caterpillar sheds its skin several times and develops a body.
 - After reaching to its full size, the caterpillar in this stage becomes pupa which is also known as Chrysalis.
 - The pupa breaks open, eventually emerging as a butterfly.

Sample:

The given table shows the preferences on the hobbies of the students during summer vacations. The table indicates that the highest number of girls are interested in dancing, i.e. 40% whereas the percentage of boys preferring dancing as a hobby is only 13%. We can clearly see that a smaller number



of boys opt for singing i.e. 7%, whereas one-fourth of the girls are interested in singing. The data depicts a significant hike in photography as 35% of the boys prefers it against 5% of the girls. The data shows that the preference of students in Yoga is fairly similar, with 19% percent in boys and 15% in girls. Playing got a slight jump of interest in boys over girls which is 30% and 16%, respectively. If we observe the table carefully, we can see that the preference of boys to Photography is much more as compared to girls.

In a nutshell, we can conclude that the interest of the boys is least in singing as compared to the girls while maximum percentage of the girls choose dancing over boys as their hobby during summer vacations.

Sol. Suggested Value Points:

- (i) Initially, the poet is in sorrowful and depressive mood in the poem 'Dust of Snow'.
 - The poet was in a very depressive and hopeless mood as the day offered no relief, comfort or happiness to him.
 - He felt that the whole day had been wasted for nothing.
 - The poet uses apt imagery to denote his dull and depressive mood.
 - He uses the image of a bird 'crow', which is ugly and harsh, and of a hemlock tree, which is a
 poisonous plant, to reflect his mood.
- (ii) It is absolutely true that one's positivity can bring in a spark of brightness even in adverse circumstances, as happened with Lencho in 'A letter to God'.
 - His innocent and optimistic attitude led him to get seventy pesos.
 - His fields and crops were destroyed completely in the hailstorm, it was his positivity and faith in the God that he wrote a letter to God.
 - His hope and his faith won when he got the answer from the God.
- (iii) The dragon looks fearsome as -
 - It has big sharp teeth
 - Spikes on its back and scales underneath
 - His mouth resembled a fireplace
 - Nails on the toes were like real daggers
 - Nose like that of a chimney
- (iv) Speaker mentions God in the poem 'For Anne Gregory' as -

Sol. (i) Suggested Value Points:

 hurt.
- But thankfully the decades of oppression and brutality had pushed him harder to fight against this
 discrimination and win freedom for his country and his people.

 - Anne beginning the conversation with greeting Amanda, asking more about her imaginative world
 - Amanda emphasises that it is important for her because her mom keeps on nagging her for no reason.
